Five Ways You Can Reduce Holiday Waste:

1. Send electronic greeting cards.
2. Use/provide durable and reusable shopping bags and gift wrap.
3. Serve food and beverages in reusable, recyclable, or compostable containers.
4. Replace spent alkaline batteries with rechargeables.
5. Purchase/sell gifts that create little or no waste (*gift cards, concert tickets, and potted plants for example*).



Compost Your Holiday Tree

Place your clean tree by your garbage bin or cart during the first two weeks after Christmas. Mission Trail will make sure it's composted.

- Be sure the stand, lights and decorations have all been removed.
- Cut tall trees into pieces no longer than five feet.
- Note that flocked and artificial trees cannot be composted and belong in the garbage.

Recycling Reminders

- Flatten and/or cut boxes to maximize space in your blue cart or bin.
- Place recyclables directly into your blue cart or bin. Do not use plastic liner bags. To recycle shredded paper, contain shreds in a paper bag or box to prevent pieces from blowing away during collection.
- Do not place batteries in any of your collection carts/bins. Check to see if your favorite battery retailer will take back your spent batteries for recycling.
