- Test existing detectors and alarms.
- Put in new batteries and recycle the old ones.
- Remove non-working detectors and alarms responsibly. Refer to the product label, user's manual, or warranty for manufacturer's instructions.

Collection Day Check List

- ✓ Place carts out for collection by 6:00 a.m.
- Make sure cart wheels are facing your home.
- Make sure cart lids are fully closed.
- Leave three feet between carts.
- Avoid placing carts near other obstacles; i.e. mailboxes, cars, trees with over hanging branches.



Friendly Reminder:

Store carts out of sight and off the street as soon as possible after service. The City of Los Altos Municipal Code requires containers to be removed from the curb within 24 hours of collection. This is intended to enhance neighborhood appearance.



RECYCLING REMINDER

Household batteries are recyclable through your curbside collection program. Put them in a clear zipper-lock bag and place on top of your Recyclables cart on collection day. Please tape terminals on all lithium, 6-volt and 9-volt batteries.

It's Organic! Easy Everyday Green Cart Reminders

Pizza boxes belong.

Food residue on pizza boxes make them hard to recycle but easy to compost. Remove any plastic from inside and place the pizza box in your green cart.

Go green with greasy paper towels and plates.

Place all food-soiled paper products in your green cart. Towels, plates, napkins, cups, coffee filters, and tea bags included. Remember, it's better to avoid using single-use disposable products whenever possible.

Meat, bones and grains compost just great.

They may not belong in a backyard compost pile or worm bin, but they're fine in your green cart.
