Best Practices During These Difficult Times

By following the below guidelines you'll help yourself & our valued employees remain safe:

- Properly sorting your generated material helps keep recyclables out of the landfill. Green waste materials always go into the green compost bin, while cardboard, paper, glass, metal, and plastics containers should be placed go in the blue recycling bin (clean and dry).
- Optimize space in your blue bin and keep recyclables loose (not bagged). Break down cardboard boxes and do what you can to save space in your cart to make sure it's not overflowing.
- Do your part to keep drivers safe. Trash should be secured in bags to prevent materials from blowing onto the street. Make sure all trash fits inside your curbside bin
- If the material is reusable set it aside and donate it to a local charity, non-profit, family or friend.

SB 1383

Starting in 2022, all jurisdictions will need to provide organic waste collection services to all residence and businesses and recycle these organic materials using recycling facilities such as:

- a. Anaerobic digestion facilities that create biofuel and electricity
- b. Composting facilities that make soil amendments

REMINDER: Please place all food scraps, yard clippings and food soiled paper in your organics bin.
