

What Goes in the Black Cart?

What Goes in the Green Cart?

NON-RECYCLABLE GLASS

- ceramics
- lightbulbs (no fluorescent)
- mirrors, tempered & window glass

NON-RECYCLABLE PAPER

- carbon paper
- laminated items
- metallic wrapping paper
- chip bags
- paper used for cleaning (soiled)
- photographs
- vacuum bags

NON-RECYCLABLE PLASTIC

- 6-pack rings (please cut)
- plastic film & wrap
- plastic plates & utensils
- plastic drinking straws & stir sticks
- records, tapes & CDs
- shower curtain liners
- tape (duct, scotch, masking)

TEXTILES

- cotton balls
- rugs & mats
- shoes, clothing & stuffed animals (that cannot be donated)
- sponges

OTHER

- balloons (latex & mylar)
- clothes hangers
- diapers
- feminine products
- foam & styrofoam
- hoses
- pet fecesrubber bands
- toothpaste tubes
- toys (that cannot be donated)
- wooden chopsticks

FOOD SCRAPS

- fruits & vegetables including peels, pits & rinds
- bread, pasta & other grains
- dairy products & egg shells
- coffee grounds & tea leaves
- soiled/expired food (packaging ok)
- meat & bones
- meal prep waste
- plate waste & scraps

FOOD-SOILED PAPER

- paper plates & cups
- paper napkins & towels
- paper coffee filters & tea bags
- soiled paper bags
- paper takeout containers
- soiled newspaper
- greasy pizza boxes
- waxed paper & boxes

NO RECYCLABLE MATERIALS NO CONSTRUCTION OR DEMOLITION MATERIALS

WHY IS ORGANIC WASTE GOING INTO THE GARBAGE?

- California Senate Bill 1383 requires every jurisdiction to provide organics waste collection services to all residents and businesses.
- All material collected in your black garbage cart is sent to a mixed waste processing facility where organic material is separated from garbage. The organic material is taken to a composting facility to meet state requirements for organics diversion from the landfill.



YARD TRIMMINGS

- flowers
- shrubs
- weeds
- leaves
- grass clippings
- garden waste (no plastic!)
- small branches less than 6" in diameter
- palm fronds

NO DIRT NO FOOD SCRAPS NO GARBAGE NO FOOD-SOILED PAPER OR PIZZA BOXES NO STYROFOAM
