SB 1383

SB 1383 requires that clean streams of organic material be collected, recovered, and recycled into new end-products like compost or biofuel. The quality of the end-product is determined by the quality of the material collected, so residents and businesses must properly sort materials, and jurisdictions must monitor containers for contamination. The law allows jurisdictions the option of offering three, two, or one container collection systems, which provides flexibility in aligning collection programs with local waste processing facility infrastructure.
